**4. FISCAL YEAR 2020-21 BUDGET WORKSHOP**

**A. DISCUSSION OF FISCAL YEAR 2020-21 ANNUAL CITY BUDGET**

City Manager Rod Butler gave an overview of the City's finances, noting the economic impacts from the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic. He reported that the City will be receiving additional funding from a grant from the CARES ACT legislation that can be used for items that are related to the City's response to the COVID-19 crisis. He noted that despite any impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic, Jurupa Valley's long-term economic outlook is on an upward trend. However, in light of the uncertainty over the next 18 months due to the COVID-19 virus and the impacts to the City's revenue, he directed that there be a status quo budget.

Mr. Butler outlined the City's ongoing issues such as infrastructure needs, law enforcement services, development activity, and the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project.

Mr. Butler reported that one of the items in this year's budget is a comprehensive Fee Study. He indicated that this may generate some additional General Fund revenue since these fees have not been adjusted in quite some time.

Mr. Butler reported that per the Council's direction, the Budget proposal also includes transitioning currently contracted staff positions to in-house City positions, which should provide substantial financial savings.

Connie Cardenas, Administrative Services Director, gave a PowerPoint presentation and outlined the proposed FY 2020-21 City Budget. She highlighted the City's major economic indicators and sources of revenue, which include proposed financial impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Lieutenant Danny Young provided additional information on the proposed Sheriff budget and responded to Council's questions.

Following discussion, the City Council directed staff to make changes as appropriate prior to final adoption at the June 18, 2020 City Council meeting.

**B. DUE TO THE COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) PANDEMIC, THE CITY COUNCIL WILL CONSIDER CHANGES TO THE REGULATIONS IN THE LOCAL EMERGENCY RESOLUTION BASED ON CHANGES IN THE GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDERS (AT THE REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBER CHRIS BARAJAS)**

City Attorney Peter Thorson presented the Staff Report. He noted that the governor has amended some of the previous stay at home orders and in order for the City of Jurupa Valley to be consistent with the state's orders, he is recommending that the City Council repeal the provisions related to restaurants and food service facilities, daycare and childcare facilities and indoor and outdoor swap meets.

Further discussion followed.

**A motion was made by Council Member Chris Barajas, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Lorena Barajas, to adopt Resolution No. 2020-35, as amended to retain the restrictions for outdoor swap meets, pending a re-opening plan and direct that enforcement of parking violations on City streets shall be suspended during the existence of the local emergency except for violations involving the no-parking except by permit restrictions in the area around Downey Park and parking restrictions affecting public safety, entitled:**


There were no public comments.
